Double hemisphere world map, with allegorical figures below representing the four continents and, at the top, an imaginative view of the earth as seen from space. \$400-600

The first detailed map of the Port Phillip District, showing the spread of settlement to the west and north of Melbourne. It was based on Robert Hoddle's draft map now in the Public Records Office Victoria: La Trobe had sent this original to Sydney to be engraved by Clint but Governor Gipps decided to forward a fair copy to London, where it was engraved by Arrowsmith to his usual very high standard.

The first state of this splendid double-hemisphere world map, in rich contemporary colour. The borders are decorated with elaborate

representations of the four elements, with portraits in the corners of Julius Caesar, Claudius Ptolemy, Gerard Mercator and Jodocus Hondius, the father of Henricus. This is first atlas map to show the discoveries of Jan Carstensz along the western coast of Cape York Peninsula in 1623. Shirley 336; Schilder 39: 'the oldest dated map in an atlas on which a Dutch discovery in Australia is shown cartographically'. \$7000-9000
